



ILLINOIS REQUIRED EXAMINATIONS

— FOR THE 2026–2027 SCHOOL YEAR —



PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:

- ✓ Any student entering an Illinois school for the first time, regardless of age.
- ✓ Students entering pre-k, kindergarten, first grade (if they have not attended kindergarten), and sixth grade.
- ✓ Students who are transferring from another state.
- ✓ The examination must be documented on the official Illinois form, available at the physician's office.
- ✓ Students must be up-to-date on required immunizations or have a religious exemption note signed by their primary care physician on file with the school.
- ✓ Sports physicals are not a substitute for the grade-level required physical examination.
- ✓ Should medication need to be administered by school personnel, a completed "Authorization and Permission for Administration" form, signed by both the parent and a licensed prescriber, is required before any medication (prescription or non-prescription) can be administered to a student. This includes over-the-counter medication for headaches or allergies.
- ✓ This form must be renewed annually at the beginning of each school year.
- ✓ Medication must be brought to the school in its original, appropriately labeled container.
- ✓ The label must include the medication name, dosage, and instruction.
- ✓ All medication is stored in a secure location at Zion.



DENTAL EXAMINATION:

- Students entering kindergarten, second, and sixth grades.



EYE EXAMINATION:

- Students entering kindergarten, or enrolling in school for the first time.
